Rafters Headlines

Today: It's back on the road for the Rafters today as they play their first game away from Witter Field since July 8. They take on the first half champion Green Bay Rockers for the first game of a home-and-home series after dropping both games against Madison.

The Matchup: The two teams match up very well offensively with each other, matching numbers in nearly every category, but the pitching sees a big difference. The Rockers have a top-five ERA in the Northwoods at 4.47.

Last Game: The Mallards pitching continued to dominate the Rafters, shutting them down for a 5-0 victory last night. It was the second straight game the Rafters have been shutout after scoring at least one in every game this season entering the series.

Douglas to Detroit: The Detroit Tigers selected Rafters P/OF Kameron Douglas in the 20th round of the MLB Draft. Douglas was one of two 2025 Rafters selected in the draft after batting .214 offensively with a 3.18 ERA in 5.2 IP.

Pitching Matchup: RHP Tristin Crusenberry returns to the mound after posting a quality start his last time beginning a game. He followed his last start with a perfect eighth inning from the bullpen and takes on RHP Mack Crowley today.

Quality Cruse: RHP Tristin Crusenberry had the Rafters first quality start of the season July 9 in Game 1 against the Dock Spiders, going six innings allowing one earned run. It's the second time this season a Rafters pitcher went six.

Up Next: Back at Witter Field, the Rafters will look for a win against the Rockers as RHP Trevor Moeck makes his second start for Wisconsin Rapids. He takes on RHP Gavin Brummond who will make his first start in his fifth appearance.

Barajas Lands in the Bay: The San Francisco Giants selected C Junior Barajas in the 11th round of the 2025 MLB Draft. Barajas leaves Wisconsin Rapids after batting .294 with six homers in 13 games on 51 ABs.

Second Half Switch Up: The Rafters lost some key pieces at the end of the first half, but are looking to replace them with some of the names who came in yesterday and today. IF Noah Ruiz (.945 OPS), IF Mason Onate (.461 OBP) and C Ashton Zacher (.425 OBP) all were huge pieces in the first half and will be missed, but the Rafters brought in C Lachlan Maude, IF Hayden Carlson and IF Kerim Orucevic who are looking to fill their shoes.

Turning it Around: The first half of the Rafters season didn't go as planned, finishing with a 13-22 record, but the second half brings new opportunities. The Rafters swept the Madison Mallards on the last day of the first half in their doubleheader, and won two of the first three to start the second half, although they hope to get back to form after losing 10 in a row following that.

Rafters returners: The Rafters will be bringing back eight players from last year. That includes RHP Tristin Crusenberry and LHP Noah Marschke, who both had success near the end of the first half being carried over into the second. RHP Jack Wiessinger, IF Landon Gaz and OF Jake Beauchaine all join the squad for the second half, returning from last year's team as well.

Other Northwoods vets: The Rafters have a few other Northwoods League veterans on the roster as well, with Seth Spencer, Eric Harper and Trevor Moeck all having pitched in the league last summer. Moeck and Harper both played for Kokomo last season, with Harper appearing as a batter and Moeck as a bullpen arm. Spencer pitched two games for Madison last year.

Butte connection: Eric Robles and Brent Gallegos both join the Rafters this season from Butte College, where Gallegos was a two-way and Robles coached.

JUCO to Northwoods: Brent Gallegos, Ashton Poole, Drew Thompson, AJ Buenaseda, Tyler Pechetti, Lachlan Maude, Hayden Carlson, Landon Dessart and Preston Steiner all come from JUCO without NWL experience.

Rhythmic pitching: The Rafters really struggled in the pitching department early in the season, and while they saw stretches of strong location, the problem still lingers. As a team, the Rafters have issued the third-most walks in the league with 348, bringing the team's ERA up to highest in the Northwoods League at 7.17. Despite this, a couple of new Rafters pitchers have limited the walks, with Tyler Pechetti and Justin Battle combining for eight walks in 18.2 innings.

Barajas Brothers: Jace and Junior Barajas have teamed up at almost every stop on their journey to the Northwoods League, and continue to do so this summer. Both came from Saddleback College this past season where Junior caught and played in 45 games while Jace made 15 appearances with a 3.50 ERA in 61.2 innings. Junior was selected in the MLB Draft after 12 games.

The California pipeline: While many of the current Rafters hail from Texas, Ziggy and some of the other coaches have California roots and recruited many players from that state. That includes 12 players on the active roster, six pitchers, a trio of infielders, a catcher and two outfielders. Ziggy and the Rafters hope his California ties led him to uncover some gems for Wisconsin Rapids.

Championship DNA: Ziggy will be joined by a couple of his players from Hope International, the defending NAIA champs, this season. The Royals made it back to the NAIA World Series again this year, although they fell in the final four to undefeated champions LSU-Shreveport.

First season of Ziggy: Tom Zieglofsky, also known as “Ziggy,” is taking over the Rafters for his first season as field manager. Ziggy previously was the assistant coach in Wisconsin Rapids and is looking to bring a new perspective to the squad. Ziggy has been coaching for 15 years and before that, was a successful pitcher, finishing his collegiate career in 2005. He’s taken a coaching role at many places, including as a head coach for Bristol University and an assistant coach for Lora High School and Trosky Baseball AV. Most recently, Ziggy was an assistant coach at Hope International, where he helped guide the Royals to the NAIA National Championship in 2024. This season, Ziggy has focused on bringing in players who are hungry to play and continue to improve as the Rafters look to build a strong winning environment.

Chain of command: Ziggy is bringing three other coaches with him for his first year in charge. The first is a returner from years past, pitching coach Mike Spears. Spears has five years of professional pitching experience and has been a pitching coach across several places since 2017. Eric Robles and Manuel Silva are the other two coaches on the staff, both assistant coaches in their first season with the Rafters.

Rafters history: The Rafters are playing their 16th season of baseball in the Northwoods League this year after their debut season in 2010. They are chasing their second NWL Championship after winning the World Series in 2016. They finished in third place in the Great Lakes West last season at 35-35.

Behind the broadcast: All Rafters games throughout the season will have a fully televised broadcast on NWL+ or ESPN+ along with live radio commentary on WFHR 97.5 FM/1320 AM. Fletcher Anderson is the voice behind the video for all 36 home games. Anderson is an intern from Arizona State, and this season will be his first in the Northwoods League. Anderson has seven years of broadcasting experience, including calling games for the Minnesota Blue Ox as part of the USPHL and Ottawa University Arizona in Surprise, AZ, along with NSPN.tv in the Twin Cities currently. On the radio side, you’ll hear the voice of Austin Thomas for every game throughout the season, both home and away. Thomas brings five years of broadcasting experience to his first season in the Northwoods, including two years with the Sioux City Explorers in the American Association.

Overview: Tristin Crusenberry is a right-handed pitcher who returns to the Rafters as a senior out of Campbellsville University, where he's spent the last two years of his collegiate career. He was a key piece for Wisconsin Rapids last season, leading the team in innings pitched after making 14 appearances including nine starts. Prior to Campbellsville, the righty pitched two seasons for the Olney Central College Blue Knights where he was a strikeout machine.

2025 Campbellsville: After a strong season in 2024, Crusenberry seemingly took a step back during his senior year, with his ERA inflating to 8.10 over his 46.2 innings pitched. Despite this, he limited damage in his outings, never allowing more than five earned runs in a game. He had a good run near the end of the season, going 14 innings with four earned runs allowed, allowing just nine hits and three walks in three games from April 24 to May 9. That stretch helped guide Campbellsville to the NCCAA World Series, although they fell short of their ultimate goal while there.

2024 Campbellsville: In 2024, the 6'3 pitcher appeared in 12 games, going 6-3 with a 3.79 ERA in a phenomenal debut season at Campbellsville. He worked 59.1 innings while striking out 67 and had two complete games. He also was named academic all-conference during his junior season.

2023 Olney Central: Across Crusenberry's sophomore season, he pitched 37.1 innings in 11 games, making four starts and posting a 5.79 ERA while striking out 42. He had two separate seven-inning shutouts for the Blue Knights, striking out eight while allowing just two hits in the one at Southwestern Illinois College.

2022 Olney Central: The righty didn't see much playing time his freshman season, but did manage two appearances. He succeeded in his first outing, dealing a shutout frame with two strikeouts against Manhattanville College, but didn't record an out while allowing four runs against Lincoln Trail College his next time up.

Apollo HS: Crusenberry played one varsity season at Apollo, working his way up from the freshman team to the JV team in the years past.

2023 El Paso CC: During his freshman season at El Paso, the Texas native pitched in just one game, logging a scoreless inning against Sul Ross State. He spent much more time as a batter for the Tejanos, producing a .329/.408/.634 slash line with nine home runs.

Montwood HS: As a high schooler, Torres was a true utility player, manning the middle infield, outfield and pitching for Montwood. He was named an all-district second baseman, although he was unranked as a recruit by Perfect Game.

He started the season with a 2.93 ERA through mid-March, totaling 9.2 innings in seven appearances, but struggled in the back half of the season.
